GOLDEN TIARA

Clematis serratifolia
'Kugotia'uspp#10952
GoldenTiara"®

A greatly improved chance seedling of Clematis Golden Harvest. spotted and then raised by HJM Kujif, Uithoorn, of the Netherlands.

"Golden Tiara" (the name used to refer to the beautiful deep golden buttercup color)

A much more reasonable 2-3 metres in height is advantageous for container or decorating a fence, not invasive. (versus 6-7 metres height for G. Harvest)

“Golden Tiara” flowers are:

- More profusely with a sweet fragrance when young
 - Abundance of flower buds are almost orbicular shaped, greenish-yellow
 - First open campanulate but then feature a spread to a much larger flower up to 7cms across
 - Four tepals are a thick darker deep buttercup yellow on both sides with a pubescent inside
 - Attractively accented by the dark black- purple stamens
 - Finishing with eye catching silky grayish-white seed heads, great for interest in the winter
 - Flowers bloom from July-October
 - **Foliage** lanceolate mint green leaves, up to 6 cm long, 2cm wide, margin serrate
 - **Hardy** and disease resistant.
